#### Presentation of the 2016/2017 annual report

In compliance with section 72 of the *Access to Information Act*, this annual report is prepared by Telefilm Canada and tabled on its behalf in Parliament by the Minister of Canadian Heritage.

#### Purpose of the Access to Information Act

The Access to Information Act (the "Act") gives Canadian citizens the right to access information contained in records under the control of federal institutions governed by the Act. This right is nevertheless subject to exceptions specified in the Act. Furthermore, decisions made by federal institutions on the disclosure of information are subject to independent review by the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada as well as by the federal courts.

#### **Mandate of the institution**

Telefilm Canada (the "Corporation") is a federal cultural institution dedicated to the development and promotion of the Canadian audiovisual industry. Telefilm Canada provides financial support to the private sector to create distinctively Canadian productions that appeal to domestic and international audiences. The Corporation also administers the funding programs of the Canada Media Fund.

#### Organisation

The Director of Legal Services is the designated Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator (the "Coordinator") for the Corporation. The Coordinator refers requests filed under the Act to Legal Services staff, who ensure their coordination as well as all aspects of their processing, including final decisions issued to applicants. Furthermore, Legal Services staff deal with any other issues related to access to information within the Corporation.

#### **Findings**

In 2016/2017, the number of access to information requests decreased compared to the previous year. Telefilm Canada received 10 formal access to information requests, which is 24 fewer than in the previous financial year and represents a 71% decrease. The number of requests appears to fluctuate over time, as 36 formal requests were received in 2014/2015 but just 4 during the 2013/2014 period. Of the 10 formal requests received, 1 was abandoned by the applicant.

The number of informal requests rose from 5 to 7 files, representing a 40% increase over the 2015/2016 financial year. This number also appears to fluctuate over time, as there were 4 informal requests in 2014/2015 and 7 in 2013/2014.

As in previous financial years, during the 2016/2017 period our institution received no requests for a release package featured on the list of completed access to information requests published on "open.canada.ca" and our own website. Moreover, the Corporation processed 3 requests for consultation from other federal institutions, the same number as in 2015/2016. The rate of these requests also appears to fluctuate when compared with previous financial years: 4 requests for consultation were received in 2014/2015 and 9 in 2013/2014.

As has been the case in recent years, some formal access requests received in 2016/2017 concerned the communication of information related to specific project files, whereas other requests pertained to all documents and correspondence containing specific terms.

Of the 5 files completed during the 2016/2017 period (including 3 files which were outstanding from the previous reporting period), only one required an extension of processing time. This extension was necessary specifically due to the volume of documents concerned and the relatively complex nature of the information requested. Other than the foregoing, no additional measures were required with respect to the time needed to process access to information requests.

During the 2016/2017 period, the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada opened 6 complaint files in connection with requests processed by the Corporation, compared with 16 complaint files in 2015/2016, 4 in 2014/2015 and none in 2013/2014. The 6 complaint files concern the application of exceptions under the Act, as well as the validity and length of the extension invoked by the Corporation. Furthermore, during the same period, the Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada closed 12 complaint files (pertaining to 8 complaints filed in 2015 and 4 filed in 2016). The Office of the Information Commissioner of Canada deemed 8 of those complaints to be abandoned or discontinued, 1 to be unfounded and 1 to be founded.

During the 2016/2017 period, Legal Services provided 1 training session to Telefilm Canada staff designed to raise awareness on the part of the Corporation's employees and managers about important aspects related to access to information. As in previous years, this training was delivered by way of an interactive online platform and included a questionnaire. Total participation for all locations was estimated at 182 individuals.

During the same period, Legal Services also delivered 2 training sessions at the head office in Montréal to raise awareness among new employees about important aspects of access to information. The two sessions were attended by 6 and 5 individuals, respectively.

Moreover, in the light of the complaint deemed to be founded, Legal Services provided an additional session at the head office in Montréal to train 11 employees about their obligation under the Act to lend assistance and the best practices to follow in this regard.

In addition to the foregoing, Legal Services continued to be consistently available to respond to the needs and questions of the Corporation's employees and managers regarding access to information. Finally, in addition to the preceding, during the 2016/2017 period, the Corporation did not implement any new or revised access to information policies, guidelines or procedures.
